At our Tuesday meeting on August 7, Lynn Koolish will break open basic fiber art design principles for us. She will identify these principles in the intuitive, improvisational and planned-out fiber art of 5 fiber artists with vastly different styles. She will also provide a mini trunk show to help us choose which of her collage, multi-media, stenciling, or dying classes that we might enjoy attending. Come and enhance your design process by learning how premier fiber artists make their decisions from start to finish. Identify which design principles that you have used, which ones that you will definitely try, and which workshop we could fill with our members. Lynn Koolish is an accomplished fiber artist, author and teacher. She has taught in the San Francisco Bay area, at the International Quilt Festival In Houston, and at Quilters Affairs in Sisters, Oregon. She is the author or co-author of 5 books. which cover the topics of fabric dying, color, innovative imagery, photography and printing. Piecemaker Interview—Myra Downs

Myra joined the Guild this year but has been attending Guild Retreats for the past 8 years with her sister and our fellow Guild Member, Sydney Moura. She is self-employed doing accounting. After having worked for a CPA for 35 years, Myra branched out on her doing accounting for her customers all the way up to final submission of taxes which she processes through a CPA to review. She lives in San Lorenzo with her husband and family. Her house is very busy with her and her husband, her son and his wife and 2 granddaughters. She also has 2 more sons, a grand-daughter and grandson. Sydney and Myra are musicians and participate in bands performing in Alameda, Pleasanton, and Newark. Myra plays the flute and piccolo. Yet she still finds time to quilt!

Her sister inspired her to take up quilting. She has completed 9 quilts so far. Her first 2 quilts were for her baby and then she tied a quilt for her own bed. Most of her quilts are hand-quilted, yes I said hand-quilted. Only 1 of her quilts has been machine quilted. She is currently hand quilting a Double Irish Chain quilt which I got to see at LAFS in July. It is BEAUTIFUL!

Myra is passing on her quilting talent to her grand-daughter. When her 5 year old grand-daughter fell in love with a bubble quilt her mommy made, she wanted to make a quilt. So Grandma had her collect



scraps of material she wanted and lay the scraps out how she wanted them for her quilt. Grandma then assembled the quilt and hand quilted it. She entered the quilt in our 2018 Quilt Show named 'From Sissy to Sissy'.

Myra's favorite quilting word is binding which to her means it is done. Her least favorite word is pin basting because it is a lot of work and in her case requires getting on the floor to complete it. She loves to listen to all types of music when she quilts. A technique she liked and is working on is paper piecing a hexagon quilt. She has been trying to finish it for 15 years as she only quilts for about 3 hours a month (Gee, I wonder why?) besides retreats she attends. She is also working on a design wall utilizing a vinyl table cloth. Just needs to get it up.

I asked her what she thought is the future of quilts and she

thinks it is going strong. She was worried about the quilting future when she seen a lot of quilt stores closing but feels good about it now.

Quilting design and color brings her joy. She is very happy to be part of the guild.

Myra has so many talents. I appreciate her taking the time to share with me, and giving all of us the opportunity to get to know her. Everyone please welcome her to our community!


Block of the Month

September 2018

Four Patch Variation

Fabric Requirements

- One 5-3/8 inch square of medium/dark fabric
- One 5-3/8 inch square of light fabric
- Four 2-3/4 inch squares of medium/dark fabric
- Four 2-3/4 inch squares of light fabric
- 1. Take your 5-3/8 inch light square and draw a line diagonally from corner to corner on the wrong side of your light fabric. Place your 5-3/8 inch light and medium/dark squares right sides together. Sew ¼ inch on both sides of your diagonal line. Cut this unit in half on the diagonal line which will provide you with two half square triangles that should measure 5 inches square.
- 2. Take your 2-3/4 inch squares and sew one light square to one medium/dark square. Do this four times. Sew these units together to make 2 four patch units as shown below. Your four patches should measure 5 inches square.
- 3. Sew the half square triangle units together with the four patch units as shown below. At this point your block should measure 9-1/2 inches square.

July 17, 2018

Attendees: Darlene Cano, Pat Carlson, Jan Longo, Cindy Sojourner, Amy Gunnarson, Carlene Stoffers, Wendey Mueller, Sue Mayfield, Elin Thomas

Called to order: 7:03 pm President: We got lots of good comments about Christmas in July.

Quilt Show: volunteers are in good shape. White glove docents will receive information on quilts to point out. Quilt description cards are almost done, but there is a problem with some photos. There is an article in the Tri-City Voice, and a sign at Dutra Realty. A sign in Newark was taken down. The program has been sent to be printed. We have new locks for the storage unit. Wendey, Sarah, and Nathan will help at the storage unit on Thursday. We have a walk-through at the venue tomorrow.

Darlene handed out nametags, and is making signs for the special exhibits. We need 3 large signs to tell what is on each floor.

Amy has signs ready to post. Room for the baskets could be tight. Amy would like a card reader. She will download the Square application to her iPad.

The Square chip reader device should arrive tomorrow. Jan will update the quilt show budget and email it tomorrow. Jan has purchased padlocks for the lockers at the Dominican Center. Jan will pick up linens. Cash-handling procedures are done for all areas except the boutique. Jan will bring \$5 and \$10 bills to use for change. Boutique procedures will be finished before the show opens. The Boutique chairs have an inventory of items for sale.

VP1: Wendey Mueller and Cindy Sojourner went to NCQC Meet the Teachers. For March 2019, we have tentatively scheduled Colleen Granger-Playing with Precuts. She charges \$600 per day for a workshop, and \$350 for a guild presentation.

Wendey noted that the first Tuesday in January 2019 is January 1st, and

January has 5 Tuesdays. At the August 7th meeting, Lynn Koolish will present. On August 11, we will have the Mel Beach "Pebbles and Play" machine quilting workshop.

VP2: Linda Probst was absent Opportunity Quilt: \$753 has been collected already. Aileen Fox is coordinating with Elaine Vallecito-Miller.

Treasurer: Monster backup flash drives were exchanged between Jan Longo and Cindy Sojourner. The files are in Quickbooks format. The checking account balance is \$7095.65. The storage unit and the church are paid through December 2018. We will revisit the cost of the storage unit in August or September. Jan may be out of town for the October meeting. She would like to identify a Piecemaker she can train as Treasurer for 2019. Membership: We have 111 members. Darlene will miss the September Board meeting. Parliamentarian: In August we will need to form a nominating committee.

Community Quilts: Quilters Dream will be sending us a large supply of batting seconds, giving us a deep discount. Retreat Lite will be August

24-26. Five organizations will receive quilts at the quilt show: Kaiser, Abode, LOV Newark, Tri-City Volunteers, and Salvation Army.

Newsletter: the deadline is Friday, July 27.

New Business: the Niles Train group would like to partner with us. We would make a quilt about 6' x 6'. The Piecemakers would pay for the cost of materials and quilting. The quilt would be displayed on the train from November 20 through Christmas. The train organization would sell raffle tickets, and we would split the proceeds. Amy Gunnarson would take charge of the project. Wendey Mueller made a motion to create a quilt for Niles Canyon Railway and split the proceeds. Jan Longo seconded the motion. The motion carried. Jan Longo will join the committee. Darlene Cano will donate a panel.
