

Adventure into Nancy Brown's World of Amazing Animal Quilts

Nancy Brown is our fabulous guest speaker for our October 2 meeting. Her lecture, "Animal Quilt Design," will delight us with a digital photo presentation and small trunk show that features animal and human quilts with their interesting background stories and fascinating design elements. Nancy Brown's animal quilts have been shown in quilt shows and galleries around the country, won awards, appeared in magazines and books, and continue to adorn private and corporate collections. She creates her amazing animal portraits with hand applique because she feels animals are an important part of our world that need to be celebrated and preserved for future generations. She is a teacher in high demand for applique and animal design portraits. Her giraffe, various pet, Pacific Coast, and hummingbird workshops are all popular. Can we get enough people to invite her back to teach us to create favorite pets or a seashore scene?

Free Blend, Contrast and Disrupt Workshop Morphs Supplies

Cindy Sojourner will teach a free "Blend, Contrast and Disrupt" workshop on October 6 from 9:30 am to 3:30 pm. In this workshop, we explore how to use color and prints in fabrics to blend, contrast and disrupt patterns in our quilts. The original supply list included lots of varied 2-inch squares in blue to enable swapping and donating to Community Quilts for children to use at Ardenwood. However, 2" blue blocks are not required to learn these principles of design. About 100-150 squares that are all the same size (2" to 5") will work, if you stick to mostly one color with interesting prints that vary in small, medium, and large print sizes and in light, medium and dark depth or saturation of that color. If you bring 2- or 2½-inch squares, you can probably swap squares to improve your composition. If you are skilled at distinguishing light to medium to dark, you can make increasing these variations and print sizes your emphasis, rather than one color. You may sign up for the workshop at our October meeting or by contacting Cindy Sojourner.

Quilt Show Financials

Despite an increase in expenses from renting the ASEB building, as well as a decrease in donations from sponsors, our profit this year was \$6260, about \$300 less than in 2016. These funds will support the activities of the Guild, taking us through next year, when we won't have the income from a quilt show.

We had 508 paying guests, a 22% increase over 2016's attendance. This brought in an extra \$910 over 2016's entry receipts.

There was a donation of \$1000 from Kaiser as well as \$500 from Newark Rotary, which was used to cover the Friday volunteer luncheon.

The Boutique made \$2500, a bit more than last year, and the Raffle Baskets made \$3200, an increase of \$543 over 2016! So on the whole, we took in more than budgeted.

Thanks to all of you who contributed, whether planning, volunteering, donating, buying tickets, entering your quilts, or however else you were involved. On to 2020!

Piecemaker Interview—Lucy Banuelos

Lucy joined the Guild in the summer of 2017 when her friend in San Diego sent her a Piecemakers Quilt Guild link because it was a guild close to her. Plus, Sherry Barr, the mother of a friend of her husband's used to be a member and told her about the Guild. She lives in San Leandro now after living in San Diego for 15 years. She and her family moved to San Leandro to be closer to family here. Lucy attended Newark Memorial High School. She has been married for 22 years and has a 12-year-old son, Anthony, who likes to sew and started sewing when he was seven. She is a stay-at-home mom and has been home-schooling Anthony this last year. Her work experience outside the home includes health and safety supervisor at UPS, plus other positions including dispatching.

Picking out fabrics and colors is what excites her creatively in quilting while what doesn't excite her is having to mess with her machine, cleaning, and figuring out what is mechanically wrong. While, ripping out stitches is what exasperates her the most about quilting, her favorite sound while quilting is listening to Christian music. Her least favorite sound is people interrupting her while she is quilting, LOL.

Lucy wants to try a quilting with rulers technique and has been inspired by Angela Waters Midnight Quilt Show



quiltingismytherapy.com/2017/09/24/making-mistakes-straight-lines-rulers/. She can't think of a technique she would not like to attempt. She really did not want to do machine applique, but tried it and now likes it. Jenny Doan with Missouri Star has influenced her quilt making and she loves patterns by Eleanor Burns.

Lucy is lucky if able to quilt 9 hours a week and loves to attend LAFS and is looking forward to more Retreat Lites, having attended this year. Seeing a quilt come together is the most pleasing thing about quilting for her. Lucy would like to hear God say when she arrives at the Pearly Gates that "There is a professional long arm machine available and you can use it as much and as long as you want."

Lap size quilts or smaller is what she primarily likes to make. A Day of the Dead hexy quilt she is currently working

on is her favorite quilt—can't wait to see it! Her least favorite is a big flying geese quilt she made which she did not cut right and is lumpy. Her favorite tool is the Binding Tool, she loves it.

She does have a little quilting room which houses sewing machines and table, cutting table, fabric and lots more stuff in it. If she gains five pounds she won't fit in the room, LOL! She feels not touching, feeling, seeing, and having the immediate gratification that brick-and-mortar quilt stores offer as well as close proximity of quilt shops, is the biggest challenge facing quilt makers today.

Lucy is really happy she joined Piecemakers Quilt Guild. She likes the size of the Guild and enjoys being able to participate and meet people.

I really enjoyed talking with Lucy and am glad she shared with me so all of you can know more about her. Please reach out to her and welcome her to our Guild.



Block of the Month

November 2018 Block of the Month

Apple Leaf - 9 inch finished block



Fabric requirements – fall colors

Light: three 3-7/8 inch squares (piece B)

two 3-1/2 inch squares (piece A and piece D)

Dark: two 3-7/8 inch squares (piece B)

one 1 inch x 6 inch strip (piece E)

one 90 degree triangle measuring 6-7/8 on each straight side (piece C)

Step 1 – Stem unit

Cut one light 3-1/2 inch square diagonally from corner to corner. These triangles are D pieces. Sew a piece D on both sides of your 1 inch x 6 inch dark strip (piece E). Trim this unit down to 3-1/2 inches square. You should only be trimming the ends of the 1 inch x 6 inch strip. Cut a 3-7/8 inch light square diagonally from corner to corner. Sew these triangles onto the stem unit according to the diagram.

Step 2 – Tree triangle

Sew your piece C triangle onto your new stem unit according to the diagram. This forms a 6-1/2 inch square.

Step 3 – The leaves

We are now going to make half square triangles (HSTs). Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on two of your light 3-7/8 inch squares. Place each of these light squares on top of a dark 3-7/8 inch square right sides together. Sew 1/4 inch seam on each side of the drawn line. Cut your sewn squares on the drawn line providing four HST units.

Step 4 – Completion

Make sure to check the orientation of your HSTs when sewing them to the block. The top set is in a different position than the ones on the left of the block. Following the diagram sew two of your HSTs together. Sew this unit on top of your piece C unit. Sew the two remaining HSTs together with a light 3-1/2 inch square at the top of the HSTs. Sew this row to the left side of your block. You are done!

Called to order: 7:06 pm

President: Cindy thanked Elin Thomas for her service on the board, and accepted her resignation.

Quilt Show: Elin will get the final budget report from Jan Longo and will write an article for the newsletter.

Community Quilts: About 101 quilts are done, and we project we will have enough for our agency donations in December. Some challenge quilts will be saved for raffles. The committee is preparing for the November 10 Work Party. Cindy presented an idea of a monthly block lesson, taught by members. Learners would donate at least 1 block to Community Quilts. Cindy is offering her studio as space for the lessons.

President: We discussed the results of holding up colored cards at the September guild meeting to let members know how long they had been speaking. We will continue to use this system. We received comments that the Alex Anderson presentation was very helpful. Several people said that it was the best program ever.

Camp Stitches: Sales were very successful, and leftover items will be donated to the Oakland Museum White

Elephant Sale as usual. The classes were great and everything went smoothly.

VP1 Programs: Cindy has written thank-you letters to our speakers. She is working on a contract for the March speaker. Cindy will take sign-ups to see if there is sufficient interest for a Jenny Lyon free-motion quilting workshop in June 2019. Nancy Brown will speak in October on animal quilt design.

VP 2: Linda Probst reported that our November meeting will be members teaching members. Gwen will teach broderie-purse appliqué. We have a request for a lesson on mitered corners. Curved binding, English paper piecing, and fused appliqué are possibilities.

The December meeting will be quilt donations to agencies and a pot luck.

For January, we will ask the church if we can meet on Jan 8, 2019, because the first Tuesday is New Year's Day. We are considering an activity based on generating ideas for challenge quilts.

Opportunity Quilt 2018: We are in good shape for Alden Lane. We need lots of help at PIQF. Aileen will write an article for the newsletter. We did well at AVQ, earning \$90-\$100.

Opportunity Quilt 2019: The top is almost finished. It will go to the quilter by October 8.

Treasurer: Jan Longo reported by phone that our bank balance is \$21,621.21.

Membership: We have 114 members.

Parliamentarian: Darlene will write an article for the newsletter to let members know which leadership positions are available for 2019.

Newsletter: The deadline is Friday, September 21.

Quilt Display Frame Replacement: Thank you to Elin Thomas who purchased heavy-duty frames and assembled them.

Niles Railroad Quilt: The blocks are under construction, and publicity is beginning. Piecemakers will have the opportunity to buy raffle tickets at the November guild meeting.

Quilts for disaster victims: Carlene will research organizations which coordinate quilt donations to victims of disasters on a national or global level.
